

Approved Minutes of the Clyde Township Board Meeting – June 9, 2010.

The regular monthly meeting of the Clyde Township Board was held at the Township Hall on Wednesday, June 9, 2010. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m.

Audience: John Hollander, Don Nagel, Rick McKellips, Mark McKellips, Glen Alderink, and Marge Baker.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Members present – Bob Larsen, Bernie McLeod, Tom Giles, Chris McKellips, and Cathy Ptak. All members present.

A motion by McLeod, supported by Larsen to approve the minutes of the May meeting as written. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Supervisor Giles reported that the water sample from the Township Hall has passed all bacteriological analysis tests and reports have been submitted the Allegan County Health Dept.

Rick McKellips, Fire Chief reported that they have been slow. He is very frustrated that the radio towers keep going down. McKellips also reported that people are using the property where the pump houses are located. This property is by Milt's pond and belongs to Clyde Township. Due to Liability concerns this property should not be used by individuals.

Mark McKellips, Cemetery Sexton reported that everything is good.

Don Nagel of the Ambulance Board reported that he has a meeting tomorrow night, June 10, 2010.

Glen Alderink of the Fire Board reported that Fennville Fire Chief Winne would like to use money left from the Capital Outlay account to purchase extra turn-out gear and other items that were not previously listed. The kitchen needs improvement with regard to the sink which should cost \$100 or less and the parking lot sealant was paid within the budget cost center. Chief Winne would also like to spend money on the building property. The property is sinking due to standing water. Alderink suggested repairs can be made without using an outside company which will keep costs minimal. A motion by McLeod, supported by Larsen that Capital Outlay money is to be used for only its original intentions. Money may only be moved within cost centers. Roll call vote – all yea's. Motion carried. Alderink also reported that Fire Department calls are way down but the payroll is staying the same. Alderink feels that there are too many people responding to calls.

Bernie McLeod of the Transfer Station reported that everything is good and recycling is busy but the electronics recycling portion is slow. The road to the station is holding up good.

New Business: Marge Baker introduced herself to the Board and audience. She is running for Circuit Court Judge in the November, 2010 election. As a lawyer she has experience as a major trial attorney with the prosecutor's office, she has experience as a small business owner, she is committed to community and is tough on crime. One of her goals is to speed up court details so the victims of crime convictions can move on with their lives. The Township Board wishes her success in the November 2nd, 2010 Election.
