

Approved Minutes of the Clyde Township Board Meeting – October 13, 2010.

The regular monthly meeting of the Clyde Township Board was held at the Township Hall on Wednesday, October 13, 2010. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m.

Audience: Don Nagel, Rick McKellips, Carolyn Churchill, John Hollander, Paul Klein (running for Circuit Judge).

Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Members present – Bob Larsen, Bernie McLeod, Tom Giles, Chris McKellips, and Cathy Ptak. All members present.

A motion by McLeod, supported by Larsen to approve the minutes of the September meeting as written. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Larsen presented an e-mail forwarded from MTS regarding Clyde's Wind Energy Ordinance.

The Treasurer's report was read. A motion by Larsen, supported by McLeod, to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried. The report is attached and is now a part of the official minutes.

Bills were presented. A motion by McLeod, supported by McKellips, we pay the bills as presented. Roll Call Vote – all yea's. Motion carried.

Checks 8120 – 8168 Total Disbursements: \$ 77,112.73

Bernie McLeod of the Transfer Station reported there is no final decision with regard to curb side recycling. This will be discussed at a special meeting to take place on Oct. 26, 2010 at 8:30 am at the Manlius Township Hall. If Manlius chooses to not enter into a continued contract with Resource Recovery the bins at the transfer station will be removed. If Manlius does decide to enter into a contract and offer curbside recycle to property owners who participate in the recycle program, the recycle bins at both sites will be removed.

Paul Klein introduced himself and asked for support. He is running for Circuit Judge on November 2nd. He has over 24 years of broad-based legal experience and is committed to experience, compassion and fairness for the Circuit Court.

Rick McKellips, Fire Chief, reported the recent pancake breakfast was the biggest turn-out ever. They had to pay a late fee for the permit but all went very smoothly.

Don Nagel of the Ambulance Board reported their meeting last month was very short. They receive a lot of calls but very few transports. Most patients have no insurance and because there is no charge to be checked out, they are looked over and only charged if meds. are dispensed or transport to an area hospital is required. Review of contracts and fees will be discussed at their next meeting.

Larsen stated that the Wind Energy e-mail will be discussed at the next Planning Commission meeting. The Planning Commission will discuss consideration of a change to the 1.5x setback requirement in the ordinance.
